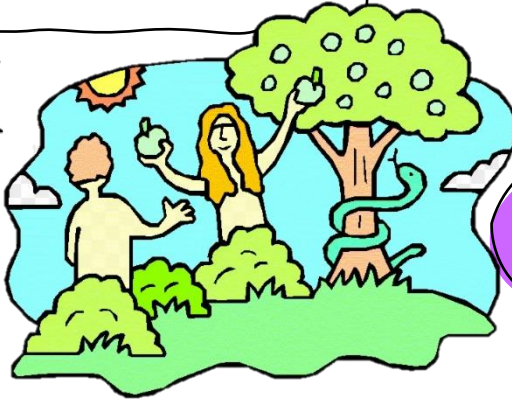
This was not God's plan

But God also gave humans a choice – he would not force them to love him and to live the way he had planned for them.

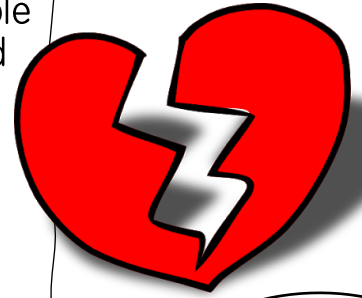

We can also listen to God when we pray, if there are things that are happening which scare, worry or confuse you then why not ask God to help you understand them and to feel at peace.

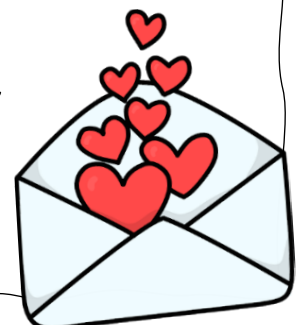
We can share God's love with others
