Can you find a way to remember the memory verse together?

A question for adults to ask children

What do you think it means for God's Kingdom to come on earth?

God's Kingdom is anywhere that God is in charge, ruling and reigning, imagine what the world would be like if everybody knew, loved and lived for God.

A question for children to ask adults

What would you most like to see change in the world?

Connect with God Together

What is the most outrageous, impossible thing that you can think of to pray? For Bartimaeus the man in the story it was probably that he could be completely healed and able to see, but that is exactly what happened!

Why not think of the most impossible thing that you could pray for in the world, something that you know would please God and help to make earth more like heaven. Pray and ask God to make it happen!

Memory Verse

Matthew 6 v 10

May your kingdom come and what you want be done, here on earth as it is in heaven.

Family Fun Together

Bless your neighbourhood: We all have a part to play in making earth more like heaven. We can show kindness and care for others. Why not go on a walk through your community and spend some time praying that God's Kingdom would come in the place where you live.

You might like to make some blessing or encouragement tags or hearts to hang in trees for people to find. You could take a rubbish bag to collect litter you spot as a way of serving your neighbourhood.



Try something impossible

Lick your elbow: Did you know it is supposed to be impossible to lick your elbow? What do you think? Have a go and see how close you can get. For many years people thought it was impossible to run a mile in less than four minutes, until a man called Roger Bannister managed it, now lots of other people have done it too.

What might God want you to do for Him this week? Why not try and do something impossible and amazing for Him!
